

Master Positions:CALL FOR APPLICATIONS

The FLI/CAU Master Program on Ageing and Age - Related Diseases is a joint initiative of the Leibniz Institute for Age Research – Fritz Lipmann Institute (FLI) and the China Agricultural University in Beijing (CAU). The Leibniz Graduate School on Ageing (LGSA) calls for applications for four 10-12 month Master projects at FLI starting at the beginning of 2010.

Training and research within the Master program is interdisciplinary with the endeavour to understand the multifaceted mechanisms that cause the development of age-related diseases and those that cause senescence and ageing. The students get the possibility to conduct a master thesis at the FLI (Jena, Germany) on a topic related to this subject. The FLI will offer various training possibilities in Molecular Biology, Molecular Genetics, Cell Biology, Developmental Biology, Cancer Biology, Neurobiology and Structural Biology. Interested candidates are encouraged to submit their application before the 1st of October for the following Master-projects:
